(13)(A) describe consequences for both the victim and the bully and impact of bullying on victim

Slide One

Greet the students and introduce yourself if they don't know you.

Slide Two

Today we have something very important to talk about: the impact of bullying.

Slide Three

We have two learning goals today. By the end of this lesson, you will be able to describe the consequences of bullying for both the bully and the victim, and you will be able to describe the impact of bullying on the victim.

Slide Four

What is the impact of bullying? Impact means how it affects you.

Slide Five

Bullying affects everybody. Bullying makes school feel less safe for everyone. Bullying hurts people. That's why it's so important to stop bullying.

Slide Six

Bullying hurts the person being bullied, but did you know that bullying also hurts the bully? It doesn't feel good to get bullied, and it doesn't feel good to be a bully, either.

Slide Seven

How does bullying hurt the bully?

Slide Eight

Bullies are more likely to get into trouble in the future. Bullies also have a hard time making and keeping friends. Why would a bully have a hard time with friendships? *Give students time to respond.*

Slide Nine

What are some of the ways bullying can hurt the person being bullied? *Give students time to respond before you move to the next slide.*

Slide Ten

Being bullied can make someone feel sad, worried, or scared. Kids who are bullied can also sometimes lose sleep, or miss school, or have lower grades. Why do you think kids who are bullied might lose sleep or miss school or have lower grades? *Allow students time to respond.*

Slide Eleven

What are consequences? Does anyone know? *Allow students time to respond.* Yes. **Consequences** are the result or outcome of a behavior choice. What are some consequences that happen when you make bad behavior choices? *Allow students time to respond.* Very good.

It is important to know that there are consequences for bullying.

Slide Twelve

Bullying is very serious, That's why bullies can get into trouble at school and at home.

Slide Thirteen

You have the power to stop bullying. **Always** tell a trusted adult if you see or experience bullying.

Slide Fourteen

Wow! We learned so much today. We had two learning goals. Let's see how we did.

Who can tell me the impact of bullying on the bully? *Allow students time to respond. Encourage them to recall that bullies have a hard time making and keeping friends, and bullies are more likely to get into trouble in the future.*

Who can tell me the impact of bullying on the victim? *Allow students time to respond. Encourage them to recall that victims feel sad, worried, and scared, and may miss school, lose sleep, and have lower grades.*

Who can tell me the consequences of bullying? *Allow students time to respond. Ensure that they know that they can get in serious trouble at school and may also face consequences at home.*
